## **Iconic Building of the Month**



#### THE COLOSSEUM

This elliptical amphitheater in the center of Rome is considered one of the greatest architectural feats achieved by the Ancient Romans. The stadium was capable of seating 80,000 spectators and mainly used for gladiatorial games. There were 76 entrances which were numbered. Tickets were distributed for the shows. each one marked with a seat number, tier number and entrance number.

Today tickets to sporting events still have the seat, aisle and tier listed on them, however most stadiums do not list the best entrance for your section. One of the reasons for this today is a very limited number of entrances for security reasons. Built from concrete and stone, construction began on the Colosseum around 72 AD and finished in 80 AD. There were 36 trap doors in Arena allowing for elaborate special effects. Entrance to the games was free.

The design and shape of the Colosseum has been the inspiration for many modern day stadiums. Today it is one of Rome's most popular tourist attractions,

drawing thousands of visitors each year.
